I feel truly honored to be able to receive the ELSJ Junior Researcher Award 2018 for my paper titled "Radical Free Merger." This paper attempts to account for asymmetric behaviors regarding A/A-bar movement between the indirect object and the direct object in the Double Object Construction in English.
